

UNIFORMS AND PRESENTATION

Scope: This policy applies to St Patrick's College ('the College') Mackay conducted by Catholic Education, Diocese of Rockhampton (referred to as Catholic Education in the document).

1. POLICY STATEMENT

Enrolment at the College requires a commitment by parents and students to ensure students dress correctly in the college uniform, appropriate to the school occasion.

Students at the College will wear the correct college uniform and be presented appropriately for school and for all designated College functions.

2. DESCRIPTION

All Australian schools (with rare exceptions) wear uniforms as a source of identity and pride, therefore the College uniform is an integral part of our identity and sense of community.

The College has a uniform that reflects the history, faith, age of the students and image of the College. The uniform reflects both the Mission Statement and the College motto "Seek Christ". The policy also acknowledges that past students and industry comment on how the students present and wear the uniform.

When wearing the the College Uniform, students should project Identity, Pride and Community values.

3. IMPLEMENTATION ISSUES

- The College has many uniforms for many purposes – all designs to be approved and recorded for security and other reasons;
- The College will retain the right to comment on any aspect of student uniform or personal presentation;
- At enrolment, the commitment to the college uniform and presentation policy will be clearly outlined to students and parents / carers.
